## Cornelia Crenshaw Library, A Trailblazer From Past to Present



A pioneer among Memphis Public Libraries, Cornelia Crenshaw Library - located at 531 Vance Avenue - was the first Library in Memphis to serve African Americans in the late 1930s. Once called Cossitt Library for Negroes and later Vance Avenue Library, Cornelia Crenshaw Library continues its legacy of service in the South Memphis community today.

"Many local and national heroes were young customers to the Vance Library, like Benjamin L. Hooks and many other prominent doctors, lawyers, teachers,

and business people," noted Inger Upchurch, branch manager of the Library. "Richard Wright, author of *Native Son* and *Black Boy*, was a customer at Vance Library as a child as well." she added.

With its vast literary collection and outreach programs, Crenshaw Library is central to the South Memphis community. Customers can enjoy fiction and nonfiction books, urban literature, the Parent/Teacher Collection; outreach programs like Real Men Read Storytime and Vance Middle School Book Club; and other Library programs, such as childcare workshops, computer classes for seniors and visually-impaired customers, and basic Spanish to name a few.
