New Technology Lab at Library to Explore Uncharted Territory for Teens



Notebooks, iPads, Mac computers, cameras, 3-D printers, a recording studio, and more state-of-the-art equipment are coming to the Benjamin L. Hooks Central Library (3030 Poplar Avenue) for the City's first **Digital Media Teen Learning Laboratory**, a \$1.5M innovative technology space for teens ages 13 to 18.

"To say that we're excited about this project is an understatement," said Director of Libraries Keenon McCloy. "We are on the cutting edge of the revolution that's Teen Services in libraries nationwide!"

The 8,300-square foot facility will be housed in Central Library's Popular Library on the first floor. Architects will break ground in fall 2014, and the Lab is set to officially open in spring 2015.
