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New Teen Technology Lab @ #CentralLibrary Reshaping Traditional Views About Libraries

<u>CLOUD901</u>, the largest teen learning lab in a library nationwide, is now open for business at the Benjamin L. Hooks Central Library (3030 Poplar Avenue), but teens who enter these doors should be forewarned - This is NOT your parents' library!

Offering teens some of the latest technology, this "no-hush zone" is filled with audio and video equipment, 3-D printers, X-Boxes, PlayStation 4s, MacBook Pros and Airs, monitors, keyboards, microphones, headsets, and more. The lab also houses a sound mixing lab and isolation booths, a video production lab, Brainstorming Center, Homework Central, technology gallery, Play Café and lounge, lockers, a tool checkout desk, an art studio, a projection screen, Dream Catcher, Hi-tech Treehouse, a performance



stage, creation stations, a gaming zone, Makerspace, Dream Store, and Collaboration Zone with writable walls.

"They finally made a place for us to be ourselves! And adults, you can't come. It's just for us exclusively," bragged 16-year-old Alana Farris. "I love everything about CLOUD901, especially the variety, but I'm a music gal' so the production room is where I plan to be. And it's free to record? Where do they do that? Normally, people charge \$100 an hour, plus this fee and the other fee. My mom even loves it here! She likes anything that keeps teens away from doing negative things. Overall, I'm looking forward to a great experience in a great environment, learning new things, and meeting new people."

"When I first heard about CLOUD901, I was happy because we always get put out of the library for being too loud," said 17-year-old Joshua Sullivan. "Here, I can hang out and sharpen up on some skills too."

Seven-teen-year-old Christopher Ross added, "It seems fun in here - all the things you can do - especially the music studio. It's surprising to have a studio in the library!"

@MemphisLibrary & Shelby County Schools Team Up for 'SCS Challenge'

Approximately 247,000 children and teens call Shelby County "home," but 30 percent of them live in poverty and another 23 percent live in low-income families, according to the Urban Child Institute and Shelby County



Schools. More than 60 percent of these children and teens - around 150,000 students - attend Shelby County Schools and face academic challenges in the classroom as well, but Memphis Public Libraries and Shelby County Schools have a plan - the <u>SCS Challenge</u>.

As a proponent of Shelby County Schools' 10-year strategic plan <u>Destination 2025</u>, Memphis Public Libraries will support their collective goals of improving the quality of public education, increasing the number of college-ready or career-ready graduates, and helping to create a more knowledgeable workforce. The plan seeks to transform the face of education in Memphis using five key priorities: 1) Strengthening early literacy; 2) Improving post-secondary readiness; 3) Developing teachers, leaders, and central office; 4) Expanding high-quality school options; and 5) Mobilizing family and community partners.

"Their goals are our goals," stressed Children's Services Manager Jennifer Hornby. "Memphis Public Libraries want to create a community for students that is aligned with schools' curricula and goals. I think we are positioned to really make an impact because we're in so many neighborhoods," she said about the Library's 18 locations citywide. "Also, as an informal learning environment, we're able to do more hands-on learning in a more relaxed environment helping students who may not perform as well in a formal educational setting."


