

"All of our programming is designed to meet the special interests and needs of this community," noted branch manager Sara Ellen Reid. "We have a lively and diverse adult book club and a newly-formed teen book club. Also,

there are a number of special programs and storytimes for the many childcare centers in our area."

The staff is friendly and the atmosphere is welcoming!"
