# Change is in the Air at Memphis Public Library's Popular Library

More Customers to Receive More Access to More Materials



Times are changing, and so are the Memphis

Public Library's policies for checking out highdemand books, DVDs, and other material. **Starting November 3, 2014** Library customers will notice an upgrade during checkout.

Traditionally, readers could only check out Popular
Library items like *New York Times* bestsellers or

other high-demand titles for seven days with no renewals. Furthermore, customers could not place items on hold, check out movies for more than three days at a time, or request that desired items be sent to another Library location.

"We've been using the current Popular Library concept for 25 years," noted Collection Development Manager Alan Stewart. "We're making adjustments in our policies as a response to recent advances in technology and to changes in how Library customers use our services."

"We want to match our supply with customers' demands," added Director of Libraries Keenon McCloy. The number of holds that we place in advance will ultimately determine the number of items that we purchase. This will be a tremendous enhancement to our customer service offerings."

Upcoming policy changes are below.


- All print books (including new and high-demand titles) will circulate for 21 days. Also, readers will be able to place items on hold or renew them.
- All entertainment DVDs will circulate for seven days. Customers can place them on hold also.
- Library customers can renew all "renewable" items twice.





# Award-winning Author and Ethiopian Immigrant to Share Compelling Story with Library Customers

Dinaw Mengestu Coming to Central Library on November 4

Fleeing for safety, peace, and hope for a better future, many immigrants cross the seas to America leaving behind the harsh realities of their homelands and looking forward to dreams of a better tomorrow. No one knows this feeling better than Ethiopian immigrant and award-winning author Dinaw Mengestu. In his book *The Beautiful* 



Things That Heaven Bears, Mengestu recounts his own experiences while blending them with fictitious accounts of what life is like for a refugee.

Thanks to a partnership between Memphis Public Libraries and Christian Brothers University, Mengestu is coming to Memphis! The author will lead a **discussion and book signing** at **5:30 pm** on **Tuesday, November 4, 2014** at the **Benjamin L. Hooks Central Library** (3030 Poplar Avenue). This special presentation will be followed by a panel discussion with other local immigrant authors including **Morris M. Gbee**, former child soldier born in Liberia and writer of *War Face*. Today, Gbee is an American citizen and veteran of the Iraqi War.

An American Dream author and China-native **Della Adams** will serve on the panel also. She is the granddaughter of a Chinese warlord. Her father was an American soldier and prisoner of the Korean War.

Holocaust survivor **Dr. Clark Blatteis** will be a panelist. Blatteis was a passenger aboard the *St. Louis*, a famous ship that carried refugees from Nazi Germany in May 1939. The book *Refuge Denied: The St. Louis Passengers and the Holocaust* and movie *Voyage of the Damned* chronicle Blatteis' and his family's experiences.

Panelists will share their gripping stories of survival, their will to live, and their struggles that accompanied leaving one world behind to pursue a new one.




