TEENS AT MEMPHIS PUBLIC LIBRARIES ARE ON CLOUD901

Ribbon-cutting Ceremony for Teen Learning Lab September 16 at Central Library

MEMPHIS, TN – Memphis teens will have a free place to hang out and geek out – unlike any other in the country – starting **Wednesday**, **September 16**, **2015**, **11** am at the **Benjamin L**. **Hooks Central Library** (3030 Poplar Avenue). **#CLOUD901** is an 8,300-square-foot creative production space for teens ages 13 to 18 offering state-of-the-art equipment and programs to develop twenty-first century skills such as collaboration, innovation, creativity, problem solving, and critical thinking.

"CLOUD901 will present an extraordinary opportunity for teens in Memphis to connect, learn, and grow," noted Director of Libraries Keenon McCloy. "There is no other place where teens can go free of charge to take advantage of such a wide range of hi-tech offerings."

The Lab will house a sound mixing lab and isolation booths, video production lab, Brainstorming Center, Homework Central, technology gallery, Play Café and lounge, lockers, a tool checkout desk, an art studio, projection screen, Dream catcher, Hi-tech Treehouse, performance stage, creation stations, gaming zone, Makerspace, Dream Store, Collaboration Zone, and a loft. CLOUD901 will offer teen library cardholders free access to audio and video equipment, in addition to 3-D printers, X-Boxes, PlayStation 4s, MacBook Pros and Airs, monitors, keyboards, microphones, headsets, and more.

"We did a lot of research and looked at learning labs across the country," McCloy continued. "We found that our Lab is larger in comparison, and it marries all the best things we discovered in our research. The goal is to invest in our youth and to retain Memphis talent in Memphis!"

"We want CLOUD901 to be teens' venue of choice and a beacon of hope to satisfy their need to know," added Central Library Public Services Manager Stacey Smith. "We are constantly re-inventing ourselves to meet the needs of the community we serve."

The Memphis Library Foundation corralled support from community members and other donors to make the \$2-million project possible. Foundation Executive Director Diane Jalfon said, "CLOUD901 is a great example of a dynamic public / private partnership. We are truly grateful for the support of all our generous donors who helped to make this dream a reality!"

Teen library cardholders can visit CLOUD901 Mondays – Thursdays, 3 pm – 8 pm; Saturdays, 10 am – 5 pm; and Sundays 1 pm – 5 pm. During these hours, teens can engage in individual learning opportunities or expert-led workshops, projects, scheduled performances, and more.
